

JOB ANNOUNCEMENT FOR PROTECTION SERVICES OFFICER II PORTLAND ART MUSEUM AND NORTHWEST FILM CENTER PORTLAND, OREGON

Overview

The Portland Art Museum and Northwest Film Center (referred to as Museum) invites applications for the position of Protection Services Officer II. The Protection Services Officer II (PSO II) is a member of the Protection Services team, which performs a critical role by protecting the safety of visitors, staff and Museum property. This role is primarily stationed in Museum lobbies interacting with visitors and staff and is responsible for promoting a welcoming environment while balancing the art of de-escalation initiating appropriate responses to safety and security issues.

Essential Duties & Responsibilities

- Helps adherence to the "<u>Visitor Agreement to Safe & Inclusive Spaces</u>". Acts as the first responder to disruptive persons entering the lobbies and Gift Shop
- Resolve conflict using de-escalation techniques and upholding equity and inclusion values
- Communicate museum policies in a respectful manner using flexibility and discretion to achieve a safe and positive outcome
- Interact with visitors in a welcoming manner by assisting with wayfinding and providing information related to the Museum collection, public programs, and events
- Removes visitors from the campus who exhibit harassment, discrimination, threatening or disrespectful behaviors
- Communicating with law enforcement, fire departments and emergency medical personnel as needed
- Promptly address situations that could negatively impact the visitor's experience,
 Museum collections, facilities, and staff by understanding and applying safety
 and Museum policies and procedures
- Initiate evacuation of assigned areas during emergencies while following security procedures and applied training
- Report and document incidents and hazardous conditions with objectivity, respect and an awareness of racial equity and free of assumptions, bias, or stereotypes

- Utilize radio for department communications and other technology such as computers, i-Pad, etc.
- Maintain confidentiality regarding the Museum's proprietary information and operations

Secondary or Additional Responsibilities

- Attend ongoing training and learning opportunities related to the collection, special exhibitions and equity & inclusion and accessibility, emergency procedures, de-escalation techniques and bi-annual CPR & AED training
- Promote and support institutional equity and inclusion goals
- Performs other related duties as assigned.

- Work collaboratively in an equitable and inclusive framework with individuals from a wide variety of backgrounds
- Comfortable dealing with conflict, de-escalation, and confrontation
- Excellent interpersonal and verbal communication skills
- Basic operational knowledge of computers including word processing and email
- Adhere to Security dress code and visibly represent the Museum

 Prior security experience in environments that include interactions with people suffering from mental illness and or under the influence of drugs/alcohol or similar experience within a social work or hospital setting

- Minimum two years of experience in security or a related field
- Current Oregon Department of Public Standards Safety Training (DPSST)
 Unarmed certification (or obtained within 30 days of employment)
- CPR & AED training certification (or obtained within 30 days of employment)
- De-escalation of hostile and potentially violent individuals
- Training related to: MOAB (Management of Aggressive Behavior) or equivalent
- Training and practice regarding the use of force continuum
- Defensive tactics

Job Conditions

- Non-Exempt/Full-Time Status
- Schedule/Hours: 9:00AM 5:30PM, 40 hours per week, and Wednesday -Sunday
- Onsite/Not Remote
- Overtime as needed
- Evening hours and must be available to work weekends, holidays, and special events as necessary
- Works with emergency services equipment including first-aid kits, fire extinguishers, and AED devices
- On-call status
- Work with chemicals (cleaning for COVID-19 purposes)
- Occasionally work outdoors to secure the premises

Physical Activities

- Occasionally lift/push/pull up to 50lbs in emergencies
- Frequently ascends and descends stairs
- Occasionally remains stationary for prolong periods of time but in an emergency will require rapid movement through the Museum campus
- Occasionally grasping and handling of objects such as pens, computer mouse, and radio
- Occasionally talking with colleagues and visitors
- Occasional repetitive motion of hands/wrist when typing
- Frequently listening to callers on the radio
